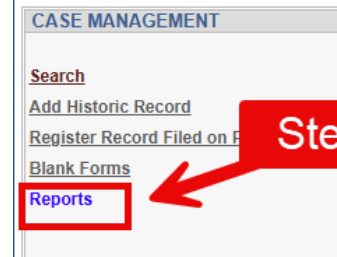


How-to Guide for Running Incompletes Report For Funeral Homes and Local Registrars

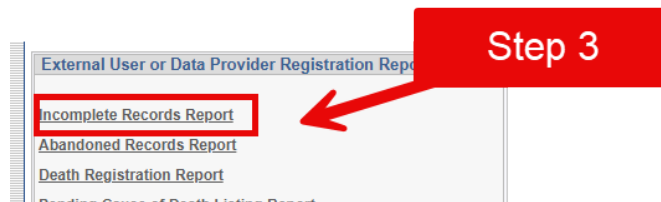
Run Report in Electronic Data Reporting System (EDRS) Weekly

1. Open **EDRS**. (Use CHROME as a browser if you want to create a spreadsheet in Excel. Creating a workbook in Excel does not work when you download a PDF from Edge.)

2. Under Case Management Menu, click on **Reports**



3. Click on **Incomplete Records Report**



4. **Select Date Range**

- Use 12 months before current date as start date
- Funeral Homes**
Use 4-7 days before current date for end date
- Local Registrars –**

This is an optional process. If local offices run reports, use 7-10 days before current date for end date.

5. Click **Generate Report**

6. **Download/Save** per your organization's processes

If Funeral Home is experiencing challenges with getting the medical portion of the record certified or the medical certificate/statement of death completed, add a **comment** to the record indicating contact attempts and any other objective, relevant notes.

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Please do not delay certifying a death record for the following reasons

- **Still waiting on a cause of death?** It's okay to file the record with a pending status if there's been a referral to a Medical Examiner. Medical Examiners can update the cause of death later, even after certification.
- **The family isn't comfortable with the cause of death?** We understand this can be sensitive. However, the certifying physician is responsible for determining the cause of death, and it may not always align with family expectations.
- **Cremation permit hasn't come through yet?** Go ahead and certify the personal section and file the record. If the case needs a Medical Examiner referral, they can update the medical section later. The medical section **must** be certified before the cremation permit is issued.
- **Waiting on payment from the family or next of kin?** Death certificates **cannot** be held as collateral. Filing should proceed regardless of payment status.
- **Waiting for the family to review or approve the certificate?** Filing should not be delayed for family review. Corrections can be made after filing.
 - Within 29 days: corrections are free.
 - After 30 days: changes can still be made with a formal request and fee.
- **Medical certification is still pending?** If the medical section isn't ready or a certifier hasn't been identified, you can still certify the personal section.
- **Something happened and now the body is unclaimed?** Please reach out to your jurisdiction's Medical Examiner. You can use "Unknown" in most personal section fields to avoid delays.
